"Grist from the Mill"

There are a lot of words I could use to describe my mother. She was tough, proud, honest, devoted, and demanding. Those were her strengths and they saw her through her hard early years, separation from my Dad when he was in Europe during the Second World War, the deaths of family and friends and the struggles advanced age forced upon her. She was always proud of my dad for all the things he accomplished and of the fact they were together

for over seventy-one years. She was proud of her children, not so much for what we accomplished but because she thought we were the ladies and gentlemen that she demanded us to be.

In the Gospel of John, chapter 13 and the second half of the first verse are the words that remind me of my mother. Jesus and the disciples are together and they are about to hold what we refer to as the Last Supper. John's Gospel has these words:



"...having loved His own who were in the world, He loved them to the end."

The passage speaks about the love Jesus felt for His disciples and how, even while they disappointed Him, failed to understand His teachings, and probably drove Him crazy with their actions and thick-headedness, He never stopped loving them. And that same quality I always found and depended upon with my mother.. Growing up, I saw her get exasperated, irritated, and about ready to throw a true "hissie fit" over some of the antics I pulled. But even at those moments when I frazzled that last nerve or danced all over that final line, I knew this woman loved me, and nothing would ever change that. Ma died last month at her home she and Pop built in Tennessee. Deteriorating health and time changed many thinngs about her, but this remained unchanged: having loved her own, she loved us to the end.
