## GOSHEN MISSIONS

Chiricana Baptist Association which is centered around teams of 3 to 5 people to tell the children and youth David, Panama to partner together for the next three years. In this first year of our partnership we will be focusing on projects in Panama that are designed to strengthen churches, provide Biblical teaching in their communities and help with the missionary outreach both in Panama and here in Virginia.

The churches in Panama are faced with many of the Louisa Baptist helps build a first building for the church, same struggles we have in our area. One of the growing problems is the use of drugs and the activities of gangs. The Goshen is sending a team to provide information and training on the methods used by gangs to recruit, raise money and the threats both drugs and gangs pose for church leaders and members. Our team will teach ways for the church to recognize gang behavior and how to help their young people avoid the gang culture.

Several pastors from our Association will travel to Panama to hold simultaneous revivals in their region. The goal is to have the Gospel presented across the Chiriqui pulpit as well as surrounding communities.

The Chiricana Association has invited ladies of the Goshen Women's Missionary Union to join them in their Annual meeting. This three day meeting will be held November 29 -December 1. Our leaders will take part in the meetings and will dialogue with their counterparts in Panama to seek for ways our two groups can carry out the missionary calling they share.

In the last week of January of next year, we will send teams from our churches to hold simultaneous Vacation

In January, the Goshen signed a Covenant with the Bible Schools across the Chiricana. We are looking for God's stories. Our intention is to send several teams to have the greatest impact possible.

> The Louisa Baptist Church has entered into an agreement with The Way of Salvation Baptist Church within the Chiricana Association to walk with them over the next three years. The Goshen will provide support as do Vacation Bible Schools and other trainings and hold them up in prayer as they seek to become the lighthouse to their area. The Goshen's role will be to provide volunteers, find trainers for the various needs and funding for the projects as they develop.

Much closer to home is the work being carried out in Baltimore by Nehemiah Cole and his team. Nehemiah is a missionary/church planter for the North American Mission Board who has worked in Baltimore for the past five years. He has established the Agape Praise Fellowship, a multicultural church in East Baltimore and works in Province. The pastors will share God's Word from the three public schools providing mentoring, fellowship and encouragement to both faculty and staff. The high school has provided Nehemiah with his own private office in recognition of his service to them and to the student body that includes members from over 30 different nations and ethnic groups. Teams are needed to help Nehemiah as he works within the schools and community presenting hope to Moslems, Buddhists and others who live without Christ. When I was a little boy, my mother almost always said the same thing to me whenever I left for school or even to

go out to play. "Be good." When my friends heard her say this and knowing my name is Johnnie, I received a great deal of teasing, not all of which I joyfully accepted. I suppose my mother was trying to teach me something with those words and not just expressing a forlorn hope. Thinking back on my parents and



the countless lessons they taught my sisters and me, I think this may have been the most important and difficult one to learn.

American society honors greatness. It doesn't seem to matter if you are a great athlete, scholar or beauty, we hold you up as special and as a standard against which all others are to be measured. It is the rarity they represent as well as the accomplishments they achieve which marks them as special and therefore worthy of applause if not out-right adoration. But, I wonder, which is better, to be truly great or to be truly good? The world with its emphasis on the measurable and profitable will point to greatness as the better, but the world's values are suspect at best.

The Rich Young Ruler opened his conversation with Jesus with flattery by calling Him "Good Teacher." (Mark 10:17) Jesus rejected that term. Not to argue with my Master about this, but it seems to me that a person who served the unworthy, forgave the worst of offenders, loved the truly horrid and died for the great and not-so-great may be the purest definition of "good." Our world needs great people. But the peace and happiness we seek demands we have good people. My mother may have been on to something after all. ~John
